Adam J. Lewis was a recipient of educational opportunities that transformed his life trajectory.

He grew up in the Bronx with his father in a one room apartment. They did not have much money and he attended the Bronx Public Schools.

Luckily for Adam, the Dalton School in Manhattan had a scholarship program in which they would visit junior high schools looking for scholar-athletes.

Adam was selected for this award and received a full scholarship to Dalton for high school, which provided him with not only a robust academic education but much more. The connections he made during those impressionable years were incredibly powerful and life-changing: his coaches became mentors, the secretaries became second mothers and the friends became family. It was also at Dalton that Adam discovered football and through hard work and perseverance became a starting quarterback.

His educational experience at Dalton earned him a full scholarship at Hamilton College, where we met. He continued to learn and develop during these 4 years, and upon graduation he was offered a job at Keefe, Bruyette & Woods where he was working on the morning he died on 9/11.

Our hope at AJLA is to provide our students with this same pathway to an excellent academic education and deep, powerful relationships. We believe that this trajectory will be life-changing for AJLA students, just as it was for Adam. Adam deeply believed in the power of education, was keenly aware of the role it played in his life and was tremendously grateful for it.


